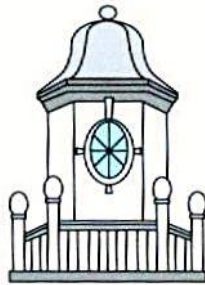

SELECTION CRITERIA

- ✓ Outstanding achievements in vocational pursuits as evidenced by awards and/or honors conferred upon him/her by colleagues, organizations or the government.
- ✓ Contributions made to the community and/or government.
- ✓ Meritorious recognition for some action taken, service provided or exemplary accomplishment.
- ✓ Specific philanthropic involvement.
- ✓ Posthumous nominees are eligible indefinitely.
- ✓ Other criteria which may be brought before the Board from internal or external sources.

STEVEN T. ARNOLD

Coach Steven Arnold is a 1982 graduate of Warren G. Harding High School. Steve attended Rio Grande College, and after one year, he transferred to Ohio Dominican University. Steve graduated from Ohio Dominican with a BA degree in public relations and communications. He was a three-time All-Conference Team MVP and Small College All-American. Steve has been employed with the state of Ohio Department of Liquor Control for thirty years as an investigator. Steve became the "Youth 2 Leaders" Events Coordinator for the Tavis Smiley Foundation. In 2002, Steve was named Head Boys Basketball Coach at WGH,

and in 2012, he was named Head Football Coach at his alma mater. He is also an inductee into the Warren Sports Hall of Fame and the TCAAA Hall of Fame.



DENNIS BLANK

Dennis Blank graduated from Warren G. Harding High School in 1967 and Hiram College in 1971. Upon graduation, Dennis worked as an investigator for the Federal Trade Commission in Washington, DC, and he went on to begin a thirty year career in the media business, including twenty-five years at Time Incorporated in New York, Chicago and London. He served as Director of Marketing and European Director at Fortune Magazine and Associate Publisher at Money Magazine and Managing Director in the Time Corporate Marketing Group. Dennis also was a publisher at

Harcourt Brace Jovanovich and at Dun & Bradstreet. He was also a principle in two successful high-tech startup ventures, one of which is now the largest network of online community web sites in the United States, American Town Network. Since returning to Warren in 2011, he started Warren Expressed.org, a web site and blog focused on local issues dealing with improving and growing the community. He has worked with the creation of Gregg's gardens, the Garden District and Warren Homecoming.



SHARI HARRELL

After graduating from Warren G. Harding in 1976, Shari went on to earn her Bachelor of Science degree in social work from Bowling Green State University and her M.B.A from Kent State University. Shari was hired as President of the Community Foundation of the Mahoning Valley in 2013. Prior professional positions include: Executive Director of the YWCA and Broker/Owner of Harrell Real Estate in Warren. Shari was selected as the Warren Area Board of Realtors Broker of the Year and was also the recipient of the Warren Area Board of Realtors Walter Graham Civic Award. Shari's interest in volunteer and nonprofit

organizations and highlights of her volunteer activities include serving ten years as a member of the National Board, YWCA of the USA including a term as Vice President of Regional Relations, as well as being the founding President of the Upton Association. Shari also served on the Warren City Schools Board of Education in 2006. Additional awards include the Warren YWCA Woman of the Year and the Warren Rotary Les Stauffer Award.



LARK T. MALLORY

Lark is a 1987 graduate of Warren G. Harding High School and a 1997 graduate of The Ohio State University College of Law. She is presently General Counsel and Director of Community Development Financial Institution Investments for the Affordable Housing Trust for Columbus and Franklin County, a non-profit lender that serves as a catalyst for the production of affordable housing throughout Columbus and Franklin County. She is responsible for

negotiating, writing, reviewing, summarizing and researching a number of agreements, coordinating assigned activities with outside partners, and providing highly responsible and complex legal support to the organization. She was a former partner at Frost, Brown, Todd LLC, focusing on corporate and business law, taxation financing and commercial real estate, and she was initially only one of two African-American female partners. She was inducted into the Trumbull County African-American Achievers Association Hall of Fame, named to the Ohio Super Lawyers Rising Stars, honored as a Business First Forty under Forty, listed in Who's Who in Black Columbus and listed in Columbus' On the Rise. She serves as a mentor to minority law students at OSU Moritz College of Law.



DAVID LEE MORGAN, JR.

David Lee Morgan, Jr. graduated from Warren G. Harding High School in 1984. He attended Youngstown State University where he played baseball for one year. David started out as criminal justice major but loved sports and had a passion for writing. He changed his major to professional writing and editing, and after graduation from YSU, his writing career took off. David worked as a sportswriter at the *Warren Tribune -Chronicle*,

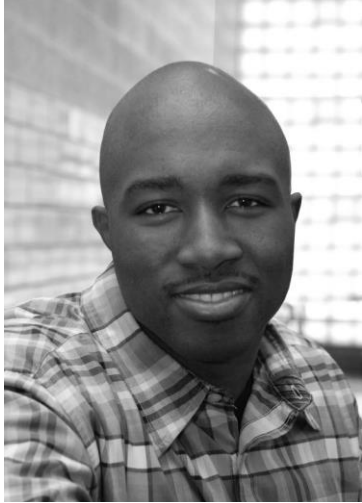
Youngstown Vindicator, *Raleigh News & Observer*, *Bingham Press & Sun Bulletin*, and he worked as a television reporter for *WYTV-Channel 33* (ABC -affiliate) in Youngstown. David's writing career blossomed when he joined the Pulitzer Prize-winning newspaper, *Akron Beacon Journal*, in 1995. David worked there for one year and covered the Cleveland Cavaliers, the University of Akron, the Akron Aeros (the Indians' Double-A affiliate), and high school sports from 1997-2003. He was also a part of the *Beacon Journal's* coverage during the Indians' 1997 playoff run, which included a World Series appearance against eventual champions the Florida Marlins. David also covered NBA MVP and All-Star LeBron James when James played at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School in Akron, Ohio, and he wrote the first biography about the NBA great, *LeBron James: The Rise of a Star*, which is also sold in Taiwan and China. His awards include one of ten featured authors at the Ohiana Book Festival, Trumbull County African-American Achievers Hall of Fame, and three-time Ohio Prep Sportswriter's Association Writer of the Year.



SUSAN E. PENKSA, PH.D.

Dr. Susan E. Penksa is a 1988 graduate of Warren Western Reserve High School. After receiving her B.A. in political science from Gordon College in 1992, she earned an M.A. (1994) and Ph.D. (2000) in political science from Miami University, OH. She is an expert in international security and development, with a global consulting practice helping to safeguard and improve the security of fragile countries and their citizens. Her clients include national governments, international organizations and NGOs. Dr. Penksa has been a Professor of Political Science since 1997 at Westmont College, Santa Barbara, CA, where her work was recognized with two prestigious U.S. Fulbright Scholar

fellowships. She is a frequent contributor to strategic dialogue on international security and development, having been invited to speak at NATO and the European Parliament. The author of numerous publications, Dr. Penksa is the co-author of the book, *The European Union in Global Security: The Politics of Impact* (2014).



DERYCK TOLES

After graduating from Warren G. Harding in 1999, Deryck Toles attended Penn State University as an Academic All-American and football standout. In 2003, Deryck graduated with a Bachelor's degree in business management, and he began his NFL career as an outside linebacker with the Atlanta Falcons, Cleveland Browns and Indianapolis Colts. After suffering a career-ending injury in 2006, Deryck returned to Warren to start Inspiring Minds, a non-profit organization committed to providing at-risk youth access to opportunities and experiences that allow them to take control of their

futures. Since 2006, Inspiring Minds has helped thousands of local students increase academics, explore colleges and careers, pursue their passions and become strong successful members of society. Deryck's achievements include a 25 Under 25 award, a Trumbull County Community Star Award, the Youngstown-Warren Regional Chamber Nonprofit Professional of the Year, and 2016 Business Journal Thought Leader.

During high school, she was an active member of the Key Club and Student Council; she was also a member of the National Honor Society. She also played on the varsity tennis team for three years and is a three time varsity letter winner. By far, her favorite extra-curricular activity has been being a member of FIRST Robotics Team 48 Delphi E.L.I.T.E. While on the robotics team, Victoria was one of two robot operators, has won two regional competitions and driven at the world championship three times. This past season, she was also selected as team captain. After graduation, Victoria plans to attend Youngstown State University and double major in physics and mechanical engineering. She will graduate forth in her class with a GPA of 4.269.

This scholarship was established in 2015 for a student with at least a 3.2, a minimum score of a 26 on the ACT, and has been accepted at an accredited college or university in a program culminating in an Engineering degree.

Since its inception in 2002, MVCAP has been dedicated to increasing the number of local high school students who enroll in college and post-secondary education. Serving students primarily in Warren City Schools and Youngstown City Schools, the MVCAP Board and Staff believe that providing young people with opportunities to further their education is paramount to the revitalization and sustainability of this community.

Each year MVCAP places College Guides and Advisors in partner high schools to guide students through the college process, providing assistance in exploring career paths, visiting colleges, registering for college entrance exams, completing college applications and applying for financial aid. Since 2002 over 400 Mahoning Valley students have received Last Dollar Scholarships from MVCAP, in 2013 ten students from WGH received this award. In addition to increasing college access at the high school level, MVCAP is committed to raising college awareness among even the youngest students.

During the 2014 school year 645 students in seven elementary schools participated in the "I Know I Can" reading outreach in which volunteers conduct college and career awareness exercise in 2nd Grade classrooms. 67% of participating students were in Warren City Schools. The funds awarded to MVCAP by the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame will be used to support our college access services at Warren G. Harding High School and our Last Dollar Scholarship Program.
